

The Lionhearts also organised and took part in a tournament as part of the Mayors Community Weekend. 160 young people were involved in a great event that brought the whole community together.

Amazing Response of Football for Life in Mozambique

Following the devastating cyclones and floods that recently hit Mozambique, members of the Football for Life programme sprang into action to help those most affected.



The 26 young leaders met after the first cyclone, and decided to use Football for Life as a platform to bring hope to those in their communities and the camps.

They helped to identify and support 33 injured people to be rushed to local clinics, and also helped in the construction of new houses for those most impacted by the disaster. In particular, they rebuilt homes for 2 elderly women who had no other means of support.

The young people challenged Oasis as a whole to be involved in building shelters for the most vulnerable, and funds were raised to purchase iron sheets for roofing 52 houses.

The team also ran psychosocial support sessions in 7 camps.
